Mediterranean Soup

- 1 large red onion
- 2 large carrots, peeled and sliced
- 1-2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 3 cloves garlic, chopped or minced
- 1 (32 oz) carton organic vegetable stock or 4 cups homemade (*page 34)
- 2 bay leaves
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 2 tablespoons dried parsley, or 1/4 cup chopped fresh
- 1 (15 oz) can white kidney beans (cannellini beans), drained and rinsed
- 1/2 cup red or white wine (preferably red)
- 1 (6 oz) can tomato sauce
- Salt and pepper



1. In a 3-quart stockpot, sauté the onion and carrots in the oil over medium heat for 4-5 minutes. Add the garlic and continue to sauté until the carrots are tender. Add the vegetable stock, bay leaves, thyme, parsley, kidney beans, wine and tomato sauce. Simmer over medium-low heat until the flavors blend, about 30 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, and serve.

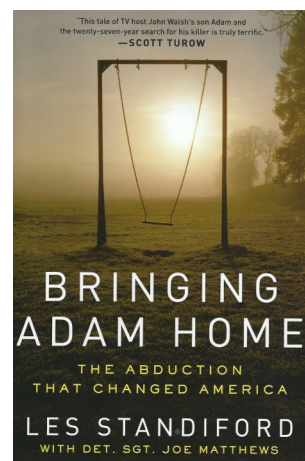

EBSCOhost eBooks has replaced NetLibrary eBooks

Look for "eBooks on EBSCOhost" under Databases A-Z in Galileo. Or, link to the ebooks on EBSCOhost from the Gil-Find library catalog:

- Click on library catalog on the library home-page.
- Enter your search term,for example, *Law Enforcement*.
- Look for **Format** on the left side bar.
- Click on **Electronic** to view all the eBooks in the catalog on *Law Enforcement*.
- Link to an eBook by clicking on "An electronic book accessible through Galileo."
- Click on the links under **Table of Contents**. Use the right arrow to turn the pages.
- Look for the print icon under **Tools**.

Due to copyright laws, there is a limit to the number of pages that you can print.
