## Oven-Barbecued Turkey Drumsticks

- 1 1/2 C ketchup
- 1/2 C lite soy sauce
- 1/4 C firmly packed brown sugar
- 2 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 2 garlic cloves, pressed
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 tsp hot sauce
- 4 fresh turkey drumsticks (approx 3 lbs.)

1. Preheat oven to 350. Stir together all ingredients but turkey legs in a 1 quart saucepan over medium-high heat. Bring to a boil; reduce heat to low, and simmer, stirring occasionally, 10 minutes.
2. Place drumsticks in an 11 x 7 inch baking dish. Pour 1 C ketchup mixture evenly over drumsticks. Bake, covered, for 1 hour; uncover, top with remaining sauce, and bake 30 minutes longer or until fork tender.

## The Scandalous Gospel of Jesus: What's So Good About the Good News?

The title of this book is as intentionally provocative as the messages preached by Jesus. Author Peter J. Gomes, Harvard University Professor of Christian Morals, argues that Jesus preached a gospel of change, of not accepting the status quo. Jesus preached "not to conform but to confront." Jesus confronted moneychangers. He confronted those who were intolerant of the sinful. He confronted willful ignorance and those who turned their backs. Author Gomes reminds us Jesus did not preach the Bible (a document created hundreds of years later); he taught nonconformity. To actually follow those teachings - feed the hungry, love all neighbors, accept those who are different - is pretty scandalous and something few of us manage actually to do. In this book, Dr. Gomes reminds us of a verse in Romans 12: "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." If you are interested in renewing your mind, and your view of what actually are the teachings recorded in the Bible, this book is a good place to start.
