Pasta with Chick-Pea Sauce

- 1 lb penne or other pasta shapes
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 1 onion, thinly sliced
- 1 red pepper, seeded and sliced
- 14 oz can chopped tomatoes
- 15 oz can chick-peas
- 2 Tbsp dry vermouth (optional)
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- 1 lg bay leaf
- 2 Tbsp capers
- Salt and pepper
- Fresh oregano to garnish

1. Boil the pasta as instructed on the package, then drain. Meanwhile, heat the oil in a large saucepan and gently fry the onion and pepper for about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally, until softened.
2. Add the tomatoes, chick-peas (with their liquid), vermouth, herbs and capers and stir well.
3. Season to taste and bring to a boil, then simmer for about 10 minutes. Remove the bay leaf and mix in the pasta. Reheat and serve hot, garnished with sprigs of oregano.
